PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION:

This rather unique Mansard roofed house was constructed c. 1880. Second Empire in style, its uniqueness lies in its crested Mansard roof. However, this roof is only in Mansard style on the front and rear of the house; its sides are located under the gabled sides of the roof, formed by the crest. Also unique is the fish-scale shaped, green slate shingles on its Mansard roof, making the building more distinctive.

The 3-story house has aluminum siding and a wrap around porch on the west (front) and south sides. Fenestration consists of a round window under the gabled crest of the roof, and two curved topped dormers on the roof. Otherwise, windows consist of 2x2 sash windows and a bay window on the north side. The house has three bays and what appears to have been a small shed addition on the rear.
