PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION:

This eclectic Second Empire-style, Mansard roofed house (c. 1880) is a unique example of the Township's Second Empire influence. In addition to several details popularized by the style (concave roof, curved molded dormers, exaggerated cornice above and below roof, decorative cornice brackets, quoins, 2x2 windows), the most visible detail on the house is the onion-domed turret on the southeast corner. The silver dome sits on top of a three-story rounded turret that incorporates the roofline and corner wall. A wrap-around porch curves around the turret on the southeast corner. Bracketed columns support the porch. The house consists of a core and rear addition near the northeast corner. The house measures 30' across (three bay) and, with the addition, 50' deep. Barrel topped, molded dormers are located across the front and side facades. Fenestration consists of 2x2 sash windows and a French doors as a main entrance. A transom is located over the door. Doors (first floor) and windows (first and second floors) are topped with curved pedimented lintels. Louvered shutters flank the windows on the second floor; paneled shutters flank some first floor windows. A 2-story bay window extension is located on the east end of the house; a 1-story extension is located in the west end. The house is stucco covered however its roof is clad in asphalt shingles. The addition is a two-story, stucco-covered extension with a flat roof and similar windows to that of the core. A second-story sleeping porch is located on the northwest corner of the addition.

Associated Resource: The property also includes a 1.5-story, frame carriage shed or barn located in the rear of the lot. It consists of a hipped on end, asphalt shingled roof, decorative scroll sawn bargeboard, beveled siding, and hipped roof cupola. There is a shed-roofed addition on the rear of the structure and large sliding doors on the addition and the main façade. It is a contributing resource.

Classification: The house is in fair shape and characteristic of the Mansard tradition in the Township. It maintains original details, such as the rear-sleeping porch. It is also unique due to the turret. It is a Class II resource.
